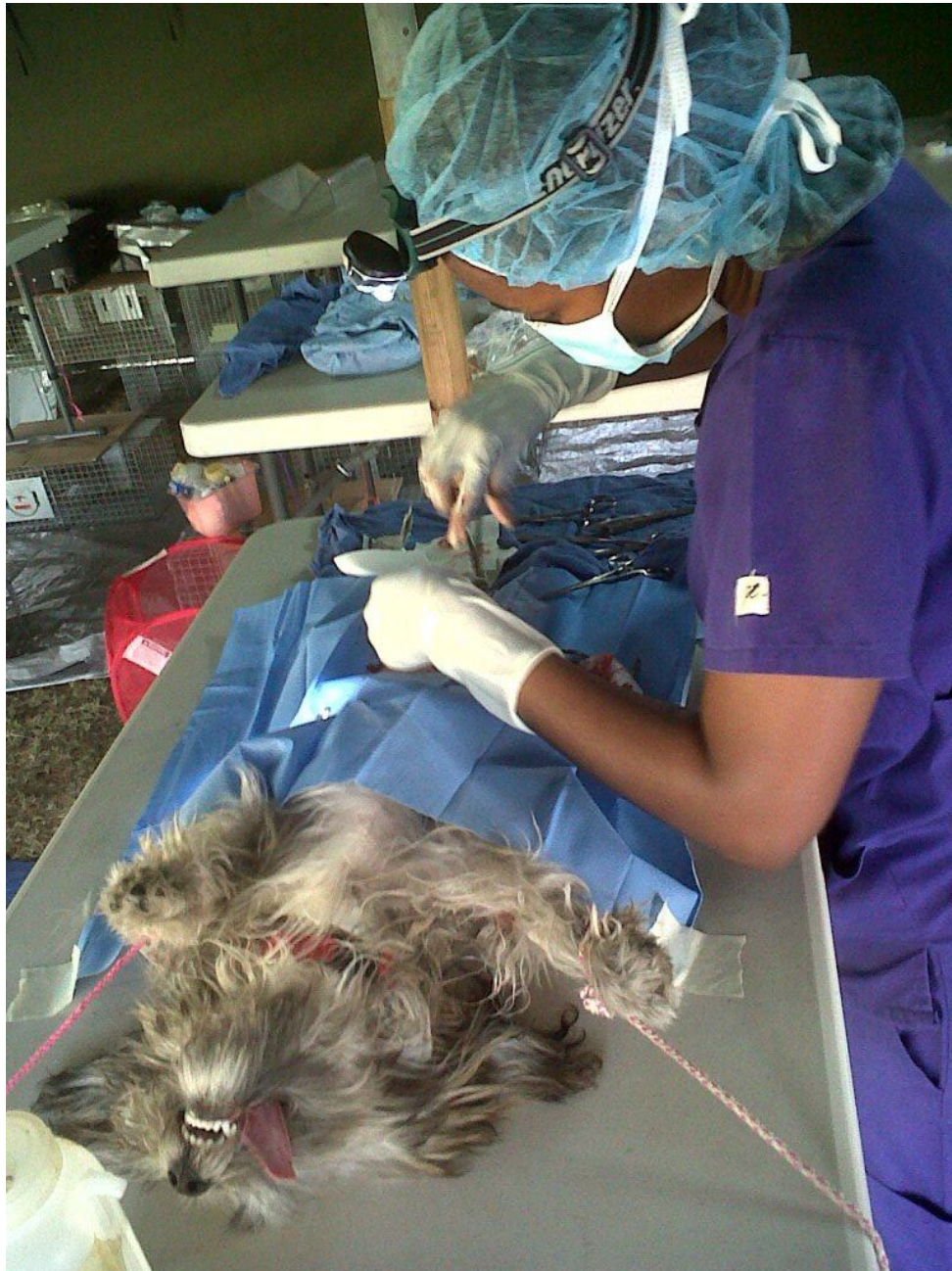


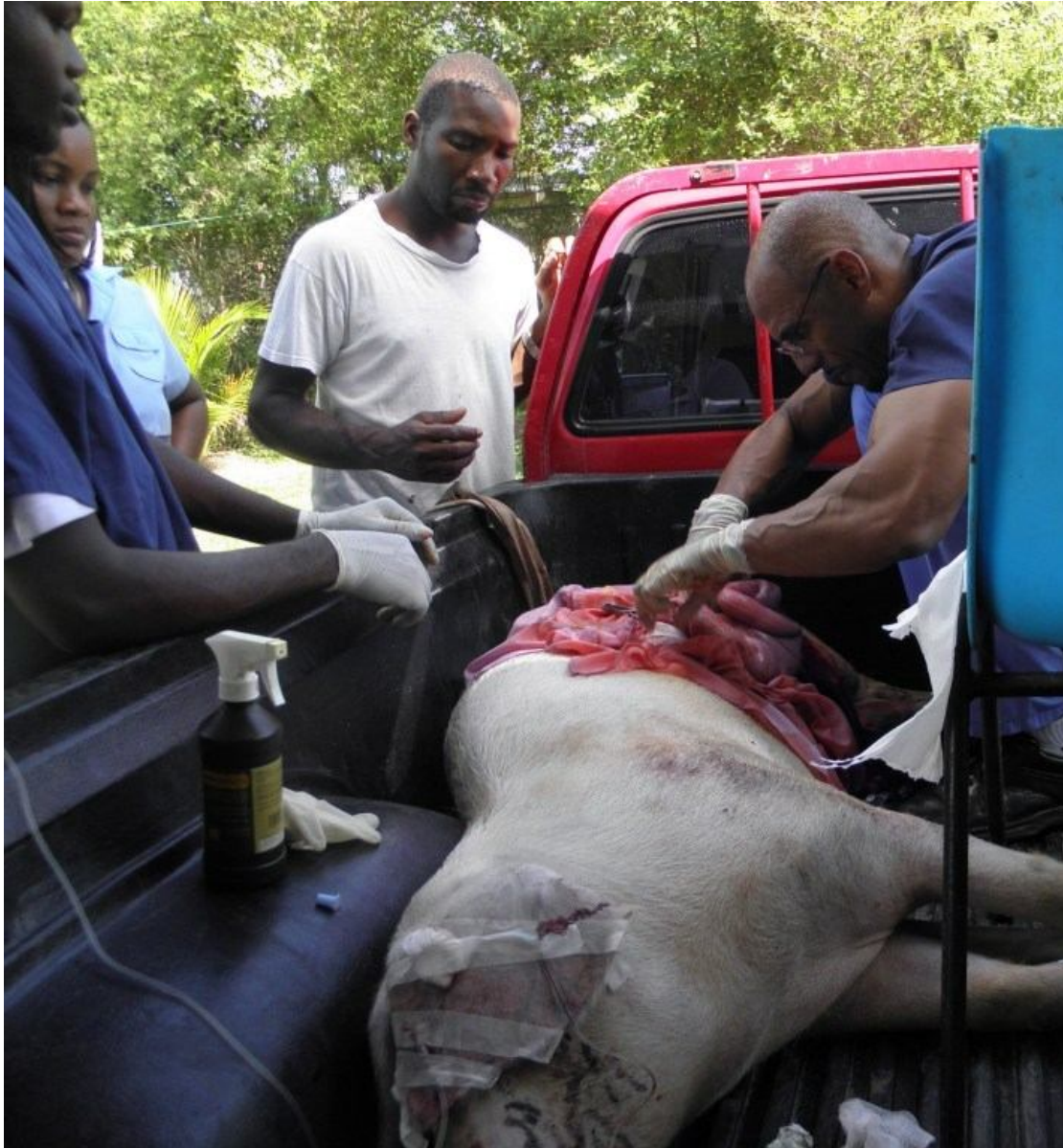

The clinic was put on by the International Spay-Neuter Network in collaboration with the JVMA and the JSPCA. Over 160 dogs and cats were neutered. Spaying and neutering of pets is important in reducing the number of unwanted pets and strays. Pets that are not specific breeding animals should have the surgery done for their health as well as that of the society.

The sow in the photograph recovered well, but sadly her seven piglets were already dead when removed."
